There's a silent killer on the loose, and it's called **carbon monoxide** (CO).

You can't smell it, see it, or taste this invisible, odourless gas.

But you can stop this silent killer.

Here's how.

Camp Safely – without the risk of Carbon Monoxide

For Campers, Trailers and RVs:

- Never block the combustion exhaust vent on the outside wall of your RV or trailer.
- Never construct an enclosed space around the vent (where the exhaust cannot escape)
- Have a certified fuels technician inspect and maintain your propane equipment annually.
- Install a CO alarm and propane leak alarm
- Use designated spaces for storage and transportation of gas cylinders.

For Tents:

 Never use portable fuel-burning equipment, such as portable propane/kerosene heaters, stoves or BBQs, in your tent or any enclosed space.



What to do when you arrive at your campsite



Campsite Safety Checklist
Arrive at your campsite in daylight.
Check the site for glass and sharp objects.
Check for poison ivy, bees, ants and dead overhanging branches that may fall.
Ensure that open fires on your campsite are permitted by local or provincial authorities.
Ensure all propane stoves and heaters are properly connected and used appropriately.
Keep your campsite tidy to avoid accidents.
